- As you watch the Youtube video of your chosen commencement address, either J.K. Rowling, Steve Jobs, or President Barack Obama, you will follow along using the following colors to highlight specific points in the speech.
 - Yellow: Words You Don't Know. Include a text box with the found definition.
 - Green: Significant Quotes of Personal Inspiration
 - Purple: Speaker is telling a significant fact from his/her life.
 - Orange: Favorite line in the speech.
 - Blue: Evidence for Section One: If-Then Micro-Summary
 - o Burgundy: Evidence for Section Two: If-Then Micro Summary
 - Black: Evidence for Section Three: If Then Micro Summary
 - Teal: Evidence for Section Four: IF-Then Micro Summary

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Activity Two: If-Then Microsummary

(Note: Instructor will need to chunk the text into four sections based on the reading level of students. With document manipulation you can add more chunks if students are struggling readers.)

I do not believe that any of us would exchange places with any other people or any other generation. The energy, the faith, the devotion which we bring to this endeavor will light our country and all who serve it -- and the glow from that fire can truly light the world." – JFK

Example of If-Then Microsummary: If this generation of Americans remains courageous and stands up against tyranny and oppression as it spreads, then the United States will be a beacon of power and pride for generations to come.
